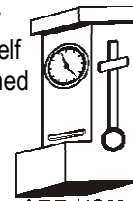

Seeing your life through the lens of the Gospel Matthew 20:1-16

1 'I was there first'. Envy easily comes to the surface when faced with the good fortune of others, especially when compared to what seems less favourable treatment of ourselves. Can you recall that feeling in yourself and what it did to you? Can you also recall times when you were content with your lot, even though it seemed others had greater gifts, better opportunities, etc. 2 A parent or teacher who gives a lot of time to a difficult child does not love the others less, but if we are one of those other children we may not see that. Recall a 'Jesus person' in your life who helped you to overcome feelings of envy and helped you appreciate that the apparently more favourable treatment of another did not mean a lessening of love for you. 3 This leads us to the core message of this parable, namely, that God's love is a free gift and not earned. Recall moments when you were particularly conscious of the gifts that God has given you by counting all the blessings that you have, no matter how small. 4 'It is too late now' are words sometimes uttered to justify doing nothing about a situation. This parable tells us that where love is involved, it is never too late. Can you recall times when you got a positive response after taking action when you thought it was 'too late'? *John Byrne OSA for Veritas*

RIP Monsignor Dr. Robert Falkenauer



This week we heard the sad news that Father Robert Falkenauer died in Pilsen, Czech Republic, after a short illness. For the past 17 years Fr. Robert has visited our parish during the Summer to provide cover whilst our PP takes a break. To him, Newark was "his" parish, a chance to concentrate on pastoral duties in the role of parish priest as a change from his roles in

administration and education in his diocese. In the Diocese of Pilsen Monsignor Dr. Robert Falkenauer held the position of Vicar General with responsibility for education, training and contacts with foreign countries, concentrating mainly on pastoral care for undergraduates and teaching activities at the University of West Bohemia and the Medical Faculty of Charles University in Pilsen. Here in Newark he was simply "Fr. Robert", our parish priest here to care for our spiritual and pastoral needs for a few weeks. We looked forward to his annual visit, his thought-provoking sermons, and the warmth and friendship he gave and received amongst parishioners and the local community. A Mass of Thanksgiving followed by burial took place at St. Bartholomew's Cathedral in Pilsen this Saturday morning. Holy Trinity Newark was represented at the funeral and more details of the Mass will follow next week. *"Let us pray to the Lord, that Fr Robert was seen in the full light of what he faithfully performed in priestly service".* (Mons. František Radkovský Bishop of Pilsen)

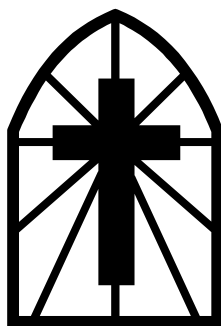
